On a daily basis doctors and other professionals see anti-social behaviour, children with learning difficulties, speech problems, ADHD and other disabilities. A proportion of the symptoms they see may be Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder.

FASD is a spectrum of physical and mental disabilities resulting from fetal alcohol exposure. As binge drinking among young women reaches serious proportions, society is facing increasing risks of children being born with lifelong alcohol related neurodevelopmental brain damage and a spectrum of alcohol related disabilities.

This Conference will bring together internationally recognised FASD experts who will present scientific evidence explaining the links between prenatal alcohol exposure and birth defects. They will explain how to begin recognising, diagnosing and managing Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder.
